

A review of Member States' initiatives to support wild pollinator populations

The aim of [these fiches](#) was to provide an update on Member States' activities on pollinators, building on and expanding from the review in Underwood et al (2017) by covering all Member States. Please note that the reviews have been compiled using inputs from various consultees and have not been officially endorsed by Member State governments. They reflect the situation up to the end of 2019 to the extent to which we were able to gather information, so they are more complete for some Member States than for others. The information reflects what was provided by consultees and the authors do not bear any responsibility for inaccuracies.

The target audience for this work is both the individuals and organizations involved in activities featured in this review, and the wider citizen network interested in pollinator conservation in the EU. The review aims to reach out to those individuals and

organizations who are the driving force(s) behind their own country's adoption of a national pollinator action plan or strategy, and provide them with access to information and contacts in other Member States. This might in future help them to act as pollinator ambassadors in other countries which do not have pollinator strategies in place.

The Netherlands, France, and Ireland currently have public National Pollinator Strategies and more are in the process of developing one (such as Luxembourg, Spain, Belgium, Czechia and others). The UK has regional pollinator strategies and action plans and a wide range of very active projects and groups, but due to its departure from the EU it has not been included in the report.
