"Meeting the Targets of Marine Protected Areas Networks"

Brussels, 16 May 2008

On **Friday 16 May**, the **Committee of the Regions** in Brussels will host the IEEP and NRDC Transatlantic Conference on Marine Protected Areas (MPAs).

This conference will aim to improve understanding of EU and US policies and legislation relating to MPAs with the aim of sharing best practice in the establishment and development of networks of MPAs. The conference will build on the outcomes of two teleconferences hosted under the T-PAGE project and will focus on progress at the EU and US level towards meeting the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) target of establishing a network of marine protected areas by 2010.

The is conference will be a one-day event and will be preceded by a meeting of US and EU experts who have been involved in the planning and implementation of MPAs at a national/Member State level.
